Three Questions to Consider This Week

Where are you going?

1 Peter 1:13 tells us to “set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ.” If we are disciples of Jesus, our journey through life is taking us toward the eternal Kingdom of God. (See Revelation 21-22.) Knowing our destination clarifies how we navigate a post-Christian culture. *How does knowing your eternal destination guide your journey through life?*

What should you leave behind?

1 Peter 1:18 says, “...you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers...” Peter reminds us that there may be things in our past that we must leave behind; it’s difficult to navigate when you’re weighed down by the wrong things. *What should you leave behind as you journey toward your home in the eternal Kingdom of God?*

What do you need for the journey?

In 1 Peter 1:23, the Apostle adds, “you have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God...” Eternal life is springing up inside of disciples of Jesus even now; it is changing us already. Navigating a post-Christian culture will require character shaped by God. *What should you do to encourage God’s work in your life as you journey toward your true home?*
